Katherine Johnson: NASA Mathematician

Down the road from the Green Bank Telescope is the hometown of a person who helped pave the way for space exploration. NASA Mathematician Katherine Johnson was born in White Sulphur Springs in 1918. At Langley Memorial Aeronautical Laboratory, Katherine was invited to work with the space task force and was the only non-white, non-male team member who worked to get a man to space.

Highlands Creative Economy

Through our Highlands Creative Economy program, AFNHA will make limited funds available to support local Tourism Summits and Familiarization Tours ("fam tours") that promote regional collaboration, networking, awareness, and support.

Organizations planning to conduct Tourism Summits this year may apply to HCE to support event related costs such as: presenter honoraria, venue, handouts and educational materials, and/or food for attendees. Successful applications will emphasize quality communication and outreach with content meant to meet the needs of the organization's beneficiaries (<u>application</u>).

Organizations organizing themed fam tours may apply for event related costs such as food for attendees, travel support, and/or tour guide services. The target audience will be business owners, staff, and volunteers for attractions, businesses, and visitor centers (<u>application</u>).

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis as funds are available. The current program year's funding is limited per applicant, though more may be available in subsequent years.
