

Management Plan Approved!

The National Park Service approved the Management Plan for the Appalachian Forest National Heritage Area (AFNHA) on August 28, 2023. Completing over three years of outreach and a year of review, the Management Plan will guide AFNHA activities moving forward as a National Heritage Area, based on five main goals. Approval of the plan makes AFNHA eligible for increased federal matching funding.

We are still recruiting for several open positions. AmeriCorps is open to anyone aged 17 years or older. A service year is an excellent opportunity for recent graduates, those looking for a gap year, retirees, or anyone looking for a change who wants to make a difference in our communities.

AFNHA AmeriCorps service allows an individual to benefit local communities and landscapes while gaining professional skills and experience, and earning money to pay for school or student loans. AmeriCorps members receive a recently increased stipend of \$20,000, a \$6,895 education award upon completion, and may be eligible for a WV Higher Education Tuition Waiver.

NVUM

In partnership with the Monongahela National Forest, AFNHA will conduct the 2023-2024 **National Visitor Use Monitoring (NVUM) Survey**. This yearlong project will conduct surveys of visitors at recreational sites across the Monongahela National Forest to assess visitor satisfaction across multiple criteria.

We will conduct nearly 300 surveys at 92 public access sites on the Mon throughout the year, primarily focused during the high-use period in the early October - November of 2023 and April - September of 2024. We are seeking 2-4 Seasonal Full to Part Time Surveyors residing in the Mon Forest region. See our job description or contact us for more information.
