AmeriCorps Opportunities

We are currently recruiting for over 30 positions for the 2023-24 service year beginning September 7th, 2023. AmeriCorps is open to anyone aged 17 years or older. A service year is an excellent opportunity for recent graduates, those looking for a gap year, retirees, or anyone looking for a change who wants to make a difference in our communities.

AFNHA AmeriCorps service allows an individual to benefit local communities and landscapes while gaining professional skills and experience, and earning money to pay for school or student loans. AmeriCorps members receive a recently increased stipend of \$20,000, a \$6,895 education award upon completion, and may be eligible for a WV Higher Education Tuition Waiver.

Conservation Positions

Conservation members conserve natural resources through projects including ecosystem restoration, habitat monitoring, and environmental education. Some positions are focused on fieldwork, while others focus more on environmental education and outreach to community members and volunteers. Most conservation positions are with government agencies or major conservation non-profits' local offices.
